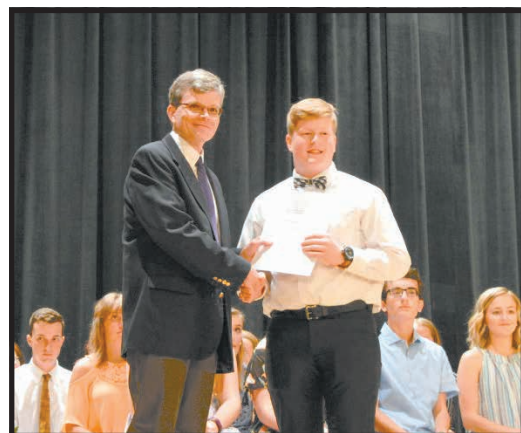

Eagle in the Spotlight

Sanford Church, AHS Alumnus and Orleans County Court Judge

When James Punch decided to retire after nearly 27 years serving on the bench, Sanford “Sandy” Church jumped at the opportunity to become the next Orleans County Judge. He ran on the Republican ticket and was backed by Judge Punch, the Orleans County Bar Association, and many local attorneys. He campaigned against Tonia Ettinger, an attorney at Legal Aid in Rochester, and a native of Orleans County.

On November 7th, Sandy received 57% of the votes (4,564 votes to 3,419) and was elected county judge.

Albion Alumni Foundation member Charlie Nesbitt was with Sandy the night he won the election. Nesbitt said, “He certainly had the backing of the legal community and that tells you something about what the people who have to practice in front of him think about him. He is almost perfectly qualified to be the judge. He has experience in all of the courts and he has a judicial temperament.”

When Sandy was interviewed after the election he commented, “I’m excited. It’s the first time I’ve been elected to office. I’m going to use my experience to do a good job.”

The county position seems like a natural next step for Sandy, who has been a fixture in the courthouse for more than 30 years. He most recently held the position as the county’s public defender for 20 years, was an assistant district attorney, law guardian, and practiced family law at Church and Church. His extensive law experience in Criminal, Civil, Family, Pistol Permit and Estate Law makes him highly qualified for the position.

Sandy graduated from Albion High School in 1976. After attending college at Wake Forest and then Duke Law School, where he was a member of the Law Review, he returned home to practice law with Ted, his father, at Church and Church.

Sandy has always been committed to the Albion community and tirelessly gives his time and energy to many organizations. Through the years he has served as a board member for the Albion Central School District Board of Education, Hospice of Orleans, Orleans County Youth Board, and Orleans County Bar Association, where he was past president.

He is a former Albion Rotary Club President. He is an Albion Lions Club member, Elks’ Lodge member, and has served as the chairperson for the Village of Albion Historic Preservation Commission.

He received the Paul Harris Fellow award from the Rotary Club and the Eileen Heye Adult Volunteer Award from the Youth Bureau for his exemplary service to the community.

If you know Sandy, you know he is passionate about youth sports. In addition to his involvement with service organizations Sandy found time to coach the Rotary 5th and 6th grade basketball program for more than 20 years and Albion Midget League for 15 years. Sandy frequently spends time at athletic events supporting his family and friends. In his free time he can often be seen playing tennis, basketball, or riding his bicycle with his wife.

Sandy and his wife Diane are the proud parents of two children. Ben, 26, received his diploma from Albion High School in 2009. He is a graduate of the Northwestern Medical School. He currently lives in California and is completing his internal medicine residency. Molly is 24 and a 2011 AHS graduate. She earned her Ed.S. in School Psychology from Tufts University and currently resides in Massachusetts counseling teens with eating disorders.

The entire family came home to be with Sandy as he was sworn in by James Punch during a December 28th ceremony. After that, he attended training at Pace University’s judicial institute and has already assumed his duties as Orleans County’s judge. ■

Albion Senior Wins NYS Oratorical Contest

On March 3, 2018, Albion High School senior Melissa Barnosky took 1st place at the New York State Constitutional Speech/Oratorical Contest in Albany. She received a \$6,000 scholarship and will compete against State winners at the National competition on April 14-15 in Indianapolis, Indiana.

Melissa represented Zone 5 and competed against four other Zone level winners from across New York State.

This is the second time Melissa competed in the contest. In 2017 she finished third in Albany. Several Albion students have made it to the State level in recent years, but this is the first time a student has won the State award.

The oratorical contest is sponsored by The American Legion. Melissa was supported by our local Sheret Post #35 in Albion. R. Gary Beefus, Post Adjutant, was Melissa's escort for the contest.

Social studies teacher Richard Gannon is the speech advisor. He works with students as they develop a prepared speech about the U.S. Constitution. The speech must be memorized and 8-10 minutes in length. Students are penalized for every minute they are over or under the required time.
